BE WATER WISE DURING HOT SUMMER MONTHS!!!!

Summer's high heat and long days result in an increased demand on our city's water system.

♦ **Reduced water use is very important during the period of 4:00am and 9:00am.**

During the summer months this period of the morning is typically very high in usage.

♦ **Please set your landscape watering schedule to the early morning hours between 12:00am and 4:00am.**

♦ **Program sprinklers to run 3-5 minutes at a time.**

♦ **ELIMINATE WATER FROM LEAVING YOUR PROPERTY** - Excess water shall not be allowed to leave the property or area being watered.

♦ The use of water hoses without a shut-off nozzle is prohibited.

By making some adjustments you will conserve water and reduce your water bills. If we all work together, we can make a difference or California's future.

RESIDENTIAL WATER SERVICE - CHANGES

The City of Escalon has implemented several changes in our Policy on Discontinuation of Residential Water Service to comply with Senate Bill No. 998 (SB998).

Changes at a glance:

- * Due date is now 7 days after the bills are mailed.
- * Late fees will be added approximately 4 weeks after the due date.

- * Reminders will continue to go out the 1st week of the even months.
- * Disconnect date is now 60 days after bills are mailed.

Auto-Pay customers are not affected. If you have auto-pay, your bill will be deducted at the same time as per your agreement.

E-WASTE & MATTRESS DISPOSAL DAY

The next Electronic Waste Disposal Day is **Saturday, July 18, 2020**. Items may be dropped off in the parking lot of the Escalon Community Center, 1055 Escalon Avenue, between the hours of 9:00am and 1:00pm.

Acceptable E-Waste items are:

- Televisions
- Computer Monitors
- Computer Processing Units
- Radios/Stereos
- Microwaves
- Printers
- Telephones

- Fax Machines
- Cell Phones
- Answering Machines

Other acceptable items are:

- Batteries (no car batteries)
- Fluorescent lights
- Mattresses & box springs

Up to 8 units (mattress & box-spring), nothing severely damaged or soiled or infested with bed bugs. No futons, waterbeds or other furniture.

Looking to dispose of your used sharps or old medications in a safe and convenient way? The Escalon Police Dept has secure drop boxes for both, located at 2040 McHenry Ave. Sharps must be placed in a sharps or hard plastic

container (no glass). Medication bottles should have all personal information removed or blacked out prior to dropping in the box or medication placed in a sealed bag. Drop boxes are accessible Monday through Friday, 8am to 5pm. ■

STORMWATER CORNER

When caring for your lawn or garden, sweep fertilizer, soil and other debris from sidewalks and driveways instead of hosing them off. The flowing water will wash the pollutants into streams, rivers, and lakes. Avoid overwatering after applying lawn and garden chemicals to reduce the concentrations of pollutants in stormwater runoff. Use non-toxic pest controls such as insecticidal soaps or lady bugs for aphids. Wash your car on the grass rather than in the street so the soapy water does not flow directly into the storm drain. To report illegal dumping into storm drains, please call the 209-691-7450. ■
