AVOID DRAIN PAIN



The City sewer system is not designed for disposing of many modern products...it's designed to dispose of very specific things. The word "flushable" as seen on many product packages doesn't mean it's true. Many items marketed as disposable and/or flushable do not degrade like toilet paper, and they wind up clogging pipes, pumps and/or causing other sewer infrastructure problems.

Using your toilet for disposal of many modern products will often result in blockages. The sewer system connecting your home to the City's main sewer system, often no wider than 3 inches - is only designed to carry water, toilet paper, and human waste.

WHAT NOT TO FLUSH:

- Diapers (cloth, disposable, "flushable")
- Baby wipes, disinfectant wipes, moist wipes, etc.
- Toilet bowl scrub pads
- Swiffers
- Napkins/Paper towels
- Dental floss

- Egg shells, nut shells, coffee grounds
- Fats, oils or grease
- Food items containing seeds and peelings
- Hair
- Sanitary napkins, personal hygiene products
- Vitamins, medicines or other pharmaceuticals
- Wash cloths, towels, rags (any cloth item)
- Clothing
- Sheet plastic or plastic of any kind ■

SENIOR/DISABLED PERSONS GARBAGE RATE

Beginning January 1, 2022 you must be at least 67 years old or who has been identified as permanently disabled to qualify for the Senior/Disabled Garbage Rate. This rate will apply to **only 60 gallon trash cans**. You may sign up at City Hall, we will need a copy of your drivers license or disability award letter for verification purposes. ■

FALL CLEAN UP TIPS



The State Water Resources Control Board requires the City to evaluate current practices and implement processes that protect storm water runoff. Leaves and plant debris are an unexpected source of stormwater pollution where they, like fertilizer, contribute excess nitrogen to local waterways. As the leaves decompose, the water quality decreases. In an effort to meet the stormwater requirements, residents need to keep grass clippings and leaves away from storm drains and out of the street.

A few simple guidelines:

- ◇ Deposit leaves and clippings in your green waste can and not in the street.
- ◇ Additional Green Waste containers can be ordered from City Hall and cost less than \$3.50 a month!
- ◇ Sweep fallen leaves away from storm drain inlets to prevent neighborhood street flooding.

STORM WATER CORNER

Do Your Doody!

We need your help to promote proper pick-up and disposal of pet waste! While many dog owners are responsible, it's time to make sure that pet waste is properly managed for the good health and benefit of everyone. Rain can carry pet waste directly into waterways or storm drains, which usually empty without any treatment into a stream, river, or ocean. Untreated fecal matter can be a source of harmful bacteria (such as Giardia and Salmonella) and nutrients. Just as we don't want human sewage in our water, it is important to prevent pet waste from being carried into our waterways. Leaving pet waste on the ground, especially in public areas like parks or playing fields may pose a risk to children, adults, and even pets. Scooping your pooch's poop isn't just a courtesy for those walking behind you; it's the healthy and environmentally sound thing to do. ■
